Trophies MUST be returned **NO LATER** than **2nd May** following their award.

Please let the section secretary know if you are eligible for either of the following:

The Hart and Levy Award is open to competitors living within a 10 mile radius of Nuneaton. Competitors **MUST** perform a ballet solo and **MUST** be 13 years and over.

The Tindhatters Award is open to competitors living within a 10 mile radius of Nuneaton. Solo competitors of any age and any discipline **OTHER** than ballet.

Solo Championship Bursary £50 and Festival Awards
To be held on **Sunday 22nd May at the Abbey Theatre**

Selected soloists will perform one solo that has been performed at the 2022 Festival. The solos will be selected by the Adjudicator; an overall 1st, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded

Adjudicator's Choice - **Queen's Platinum Jubilee Trophy** From entries across the Festival the Adjudicator will choose one entry that best encapsulates the theme of 'Royalty' as a celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. The winner of this trophy will be able to keep the trophy following the 2022 Festival.

Although Sharon enjoyed performing professionally, her real passion lay in teaching and on becoming a qualified teacher with the IDTA in 1981 soon opened up her own school in addition to teaching within state schools training pupils from year 6 through to GCSE and A level in all aspects of performing arts.

Sharon is the organiser of the Shepshed Spring and Summer festivals and Director/Principal of a thriving Performing Arts school based in the East Midlands, training students for Musical Theatre, Television and film work.

Stage Dancing Section Rules and Conditions of Entry: Amateurs only!

1. **Status:** The competition is for amateurs and students who do not derive the main part of their income from the teaching or performing of dance.
2. **Entry Forms:** Competitors must send their entry form and fee to the section secretary by the closing date. To comply with the safeguarding procedures, the official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form must be completed and signed. **Amateurs only.** (Entry forms are available to download from the Festival website).
Any new schools wishing to enter the festival must contact the section secretary to determine availability of space within that year's festival.
3. **Email Entries:** Will be accepted. The email must give all the information requested on the entry form. However, the entry fee together with the signed declaration on the entry form **MUST** be received by the section secretary by the closing date for entries.
4. **Payment:** Payment may be made by cheque, (made payable to Nuneaton Festival of Arts) Cash or by Bank transfer.
5. **Age:** Competitor age as of the 1st September with All England Dance qualifying rules.
6. **Sections:** The committee may combine sections when entries are small, divide a class when entries are large and have the power to interpret any of these rules as the occasion may arise. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entries.
7. **Liability:** The Festival does not accept liability for the infringement of copyright, recording or performing rights arising out of any competitor's accompaniment or performance. Teachers are advised that they are responsible for their own licences.
8. **Adjudicator:** The Adjudicator's decision is final and no discussion or correspondence concerning such decisions may ensue. The Adjudicator can reserve the right not to award any place, if, in their opinion, the standard was insufficiently high. First, second and third place medals will be awarded in each section, with the exception of troupes and groups.
9. **Performance:** Competitors may perform **ONCE** only in their own age group for each solo section and for each dance technique in a duet or trio section with the same partner.. The age of the eldest in a duet, trio or group determines the correct class.
10. **Time Limits: Must not be exceeded** and, the section will be rigidly timed. If a child is 'gonged' then he/she **must** leave the stage immediately. Competitors are advised to arrive and be ready to perform at least half an hour before the section is due to take place.

The Time Limits are:

Solos 10 years and under:	1½ minutes, 2 minutes for Song and Dance
Solos 11 years and over:	2 minutes, 2½ minutes for Song and Dance
Duets:	2½ minutes, 3 minutes for Song and Dance
Trios:	2½ minutes, 3 minutes for Song and Dance
Groups/Troupes:	4 minutes, 4½ minutes for Song and Dance

11. **Accompaniment:** For any song and dance must **not** include any recorded singing or chanting. Accompaniment for any tap section must **not** include any recorded tap or similar sound effect.
12. **Pointe:** Work is **not** allowed for any competitor under 14 years old. Fixed tap only may be used for tap dancing.
13. **Novice:** Novice classes are open to those who **have not** been placed first in any competition.
14. **Late Entries:** Please note that late entries will **not** accepted.
15. **Photography:** No photography or filming by equipment of any kind, including mobile phones, is allowed during performances.
16. **Trophies:** to be returned by the first day of the dance section festival.

SAFETY OF PERFORMERS

It is necessary for teachers and parents to be aware of their responsibilities in entering performers with limited physical or special needs, bearing in mind the limitations imposed by the stage and surrounding environment. It is also necessary for the teacher or parent to pass on to the Adjudicator, via the organiser, any such information that would impact on the Adjudicators' work.

- **'Own Choice'** - Titles and composers of 'own choice' pieces **MUST** be given on the entry form.
Copyright - The festival is under a legal obligation to supply to the Performing Arts Society details of ALL items performed at the Festival and the co-operation of teachers and competitors in sending information at the correct time would be appreciated. All performances must comply with the copyright arrangements detailed below.
- The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech (BIFF) has negotiated group licensing arrangements with the Phonographic Performance Limited (PPL) for Music (PRS), Music Publishers Association (MPA), Copyright Licensing Agency (CLA) and Author's Licensing and Collecting Society (ALCS).

- The Committee reserve the right to exclude material which may cause offence, or could be considered prejudicial or discriminatory in any way.
- **The Nuneaton Festival** – is pleased to announce that it has entered into an agreement with the Author's Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that **entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items* performed, to a time limit of 10 minutes.**
Performers and teachers will be delighted to know that their participation in this festival means that authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this festival.
Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.
*Dramatic items must be announced with the title and author at the time of the performance to qualify for copyright indemnity and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.
