\*Dramatic items must be announced with the title and author at the time of the performance to qualify for copyright indemnity and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.

Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry, If anyone is unsure what they need to do in this respect, they should call 01625 428297, the British & International Federation of Festivals, for advice.

# Art Section rules and conditions of entry

- Entry forms: Please bring the completed entry form together with your work and entry fee to the Museum and Art Gallery on entry days. To comply with the Safeguarding Policy procedures the official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form MUST be completed and signed. Amateurs only! (Entry forms are available to download as well on the Festival website).
- 2. Payment: Payment may be made by cheque, (made payable to Nuneaton Festival of Arts), Cash, BACS, Bank card
- 3. Entries: Only 4 entries allowed per individual, of which 3 can be for sale. All work must be original, (no prints allowed).

Depending on the number of entries, all entries will be adjudicated but the Museum cannot guarantee that all the work will be hung.

4. Late Entries: Cannot be accepted.

#### 5. Sizes: DUE TO LIMITED HANGING SPACE <u>PLEASE ADHERE TO THE SIZE LIMITS AS ANY OVERSIZED ENTRIES MAY NOT BE ACCEPTED OR HUNG.</u> IF ACCEPTED, <u>IT MAY BE ADJUDICATED BUT NO PRIZE WILL BE GIVEN</u>

6. **Labels**: All work must have **two labels**, please print full name OR school, festival class number and title of piece of work.

**For under 18's entered by a school: (Framing optional)**. One label on the front of the work with name, title of work and Festival Class Number and one label attached by string to the hanging cord situated on the back with the name of the school, title of work and Festival Class Number.

**For under 18's individual entries**: **(Framing optional).** All work must have two labels; one label on the front of the work with name, title of work and Festival Class Number and the second one containing the same information attached by string to the hanging cord on the back so that it can be clearly seen when hung over the face of the work.

**For over 18's individual entries:** All work must be framed and have two labels. The first label to be attached to the back of the work with the artist's name, title of work, medium, size, class number and current price (if applicable) The second one containing the same information attached by string to the hanging cord on the back so that it can be clearly seen when hung over the face of the work.

- Framing: All framed work must be securely screw eyed and strung ready for hanging, those not strung cannot be displayed. The framing needs to be firm, rigid and sturdy in good condition and appropriate to the size of work (See Museum guidance).





# Stage Dancing Section Rules and Conditions of Entry: <u>Amateurs only!</u>

- 1. **Status:** The competition is for amateurs and students who do not derive the main part of their income from the teaching or performing of dance or those who do not attend vocational training courses.
- Entry Forms: Competitors must send their entry form and fee to the section secretary by the closing date. To comply with the safeguarding procedures, the official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form must be completed and signed.
   Amateurs only. (Entry forms are available to download from the Festival website). Any new schools wishing to enter the festival must contact the section secretary to determine availability of space within that year's festival.
- 3. **Email Entries**: Will be accepted. The email must give all the information requested on the entry form. However, the entry fee together with the signed declaration on the entry form **MUST** be received by the section secretary by the closing date for entries.
- 4. **Payment:** Payment may be made by cheque, (made payable to Nuneaton Festival of Arts) Cash or by Bank transfer.
- 5. Age: Competitors age as of the 1st September 2023 with All England Dance qualifying rules.
- 6. **Sections:** The committee may combine sections when entries are small, divide a class when entries are large and have the power to interpret any of these rules as the occasion may arise. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entries.
- 7. **Liability:** The Festival does not accept liability for the infringement of copyright, recording or performing rights arising out of any competitor's accompaniment or performance. Teachers are advised that they are responsible for their own licences.
- 8. **Adjudicator:** The Adjudicator's decision is final and no discussion or correspondence concerning such decisions may ensue. The Adjudicator can reserve the right not to award any place, if, in their opinion, the standard was insufficiently high. First, second and third place medals will be awarded in each section, with the exception of troupes and groups.
- 9. **Performance:** Competitors may perform **ONCE** only in their own age group for each solo section and for each dance technique in a duet or trio section with the same partner. The age of the eldest in a duet, trio or group determines the correct class.
- 10. **Time Limits: Must not** be exceeded and, the section will be rigidly timed. If a child is 'gonged' then he/she <u>must</u> leave the stage immediately. Competitors are advised to arrive and be ready to perform at least half an hour before the section is due to take place.

The Time Limits are:

Solos 10 years and under:1½ minutes,2 minutesfor Musical TheatreSolos 11 years and over:2 minutes,2½ minutes for Musical TheatreDuets:2½ minutes,3 minutesfor Musical TheatreTrios:2½ minutes,3 minutesfor Musical TheatreGroups/Troupes:4 minutes,4½ minutes for Musical Theatre

- 11. **Accompaniment:** For any Musical Theatre it must **not** include any recorded singing or chanting. Accompaniment for any tap section must **not** include any recorded tap or similar sound effect.
- 12. **Pointe:** Work is **not** allowed for any competitor under 14 years old. Fixed tap only may be used for tap dancing.
- 13. Novice: Novice classes are open to those who have not been placed first in any competition.
- 14. Late Entries: Please note that late entries will not accepted.
- 15. **Photography:** No photography or filming by equipment of any kind, including mobile phones, is allowed during performances.
- 16. **Trophies:** to be returned by no later than 4th May following the award.
- 17. See website/full syllabus for Federation rules, safeguarding/GDPR/privacy policy.
- 18. <u>SHOES MUST</u> BE WORN WHEN WALKING AROUND THE THEATRE UNTIL THE COMPETITOR/S ARE IN THE BACKSTAGE AREA.



#### 4) Multiple Entries

- a) Competitors may enter more than once in the same class **EXCEPT** solo classes, **providing** in a set piece class they play a different instrument/part or piece of music.
- b) Competitors may not perform the same piece in more than one class.
- 5) Age Limit The age limit for all classes in this section is 1st September following the competition.
- In group classes, all competitors must be within the age limit.

#### NB Infringement of rules 2- 5 will result in competitors being adjudicated but not marked.

#### 6) Official Accompanist

- a) The services of the Official Accompanist are available to competitors. Competitors must indicate their requirement of this facility on their entry form. Competitors using this service will be required to pay an additional fee of £4.00 per class entered.
- b) Where the Official Accompanist has been requested, performers in all classes are asked to ensure that all music is sent to the Section Secretary by 31st March 2024. It is strongly recommended that performers arrange at least one practice session beforehand with the Official Accompanist. This will be a private agreement, subject to the Official Accompanist's fees.

#### 7) Music

- a) Set Piece performances should include all repeats unless detailed differently. Performers of Own Choice Pieces should observe *da capo* and *dal segno* indications, and may play other repeats within the appropriate time limits.
- b) Own choice titles and composers MUST be given on the Entry Form. Competitors failing to give this information will have their entry forms returned. Competitors offering a different piece to that specified on their entry form are requested to inform the Section Secretary, in writing, at least two weeks before the date of the performance.
- c) A copy of the "own choice" piece of music MUST be made available for the use of the Adjudicator. This may be a photocopy, which will be retained by the Section Secretary and destroyed after the competition. Competitors are reminded that they **must not** use photocopies for the performance unless written permission of the publisher is obtained and given to the Section Secretary.
- d) The Festival is under a legal obligation to supply to the Performing Rights Society details of all items performed at the Festival, and the co-operation of teachers and competitors in sending information at the correct time would be very much appreciated.

#### 8) Late Entries

Late entries will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances, and may not appear in the programme.

#### 9) Changes to Programme

The timing of classes will be arranged to suit the section as a whole and not to accommodate individual performers. No changes can be made after the programme is completed.

#### 10) Festival's General Rules

Competitors/Teachers/ Parents are also requested to read the Festival's General Rules which can be found in the Full Syllabus, on the Festival's web site (**www.nuneatonfoa.org.uk**) or obtained from the section secretary. In particular your attention is drawn to General Rule 3. In this connection there are now two classes for Teachers to enter with their Pupils (M.TP1 and M.TP2), where General Rule 3 does not apply.

#### SAFETY OF PERFORMERS

It is necessary for teachers and parents to be aware of their responsibilities in entering performers with limited physical or special needs, bearing in mind the limitations imposed by the stage and surrounding environment. It is also necessary for the teacher or parent to pass on to the adjudicator, via the organiser, any such information that would impact on the adjudicator's work.

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

#### **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. The closing date for entries is as stated in each section
- 2. Except where specific section rules apply, the age limit date for group entries is 1st September. For individual entries it is the first day of any section competition. The signature on the entry form will be the guarantee that the competitor's age is correct. The committee reserves the right to request to see a birth certificate should any question arise.
- 3. Competitors must be amateur\* bona fide members of the organisation they represent.

# \*Amateur is defined as a person who does not make his/her <u>living</u>, by <u>performing</u> or <u>teaching</u>, in the discipline involved; e.g. a teacher may be allowed to enter, at the Festivals discretion, if playing a different instrument from that upon which he/she makes a living.

- 4. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- 5. To comply with the Safe Guarding Policy and Privacy Policy the Official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form **MUST** be completed and signed.
- 6. Email entries will be accepted, however, cheque/cash/bank transfer for the entry fee together with the signed declarations on the application form **MUST** be received by the section secretary by the closing date for entries. The email **MUST** give all the information requested on the entry form, (Entry forms are available to download on the Festival website).
- 7. Competitors are limited to the number of entries they can make. Please see individual sections for the number of entries allowed.
- 8. The Committee may decline to accept an entry or may limit, cancel or subdivide any competition.
- 9. First, second and third place certificates may be awarded in each class to competitors who gain the three highest number of marks. The Adjudicator may, at his/her discretion, withhold the award of a first or second place certificate where there are fewer than three competitors and a third place certificate where there are less than ten competitors. In the event of a tie for one of the places, a certificate will be awarded to each competitor gaining the relevant mark. An Adjudicator may also withhold place awards and trophies where he/she considers that the standard is not sufficiently high to merit them. Certificates of Achievement will be awarded in accordance with the Adjudicator's decision.
- 10. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 11. Trophies are awarded for a nominal year only. All trophies must be returned the following year to the section secretary by the date stated on the Trophy receipts.
- 12. Winners of classes should be prepared to take part in a Festival concert or event if required to do so
  <u>PERFORMING ARTS ONLY</u> (Piano, Speech and Drama, Stage Dancing, Vocal, Woodwind, Strings and Brass)
- 13. (Not applicable to Stage Dancing) Competitors will only be admitted on production of their admission cards. These will be forwarded to the competitors and will be applicable for the session indicated on the card. Competitors who have **not** received the card fourteen days before the adjudication period should contact the section secretary.
- 14. The order of competing is determined at the Section Secretary's discretion.
- 15. Every effort will be made to adhere to the schedule, however, should alterations be necessary, entrance fees will not be returned after the programme has been finalised and adjudicator and venue booked.
- 16. Competitors who do not respond when called upon to perform may be disqualified.
- 17. Competitors must collect adjudication sheets, copies of music, texts and any certificates from the Adjudicator's steward at the end of each class. (For Stage Dancing only collect at the end of the day). Requests for posting these must be agreed with that steward and postage prepaid.
- 18. No competitor may perform more than once in the same class OR play the same piece in more than one class.
- 19. No photography or filming by equipment of any kind, including mobile phones, is allowed <u>during performances</u>. Permission for photographs of their own child receiving an award, for personal use, may be given by the section secretary, upon request.

20. (a) The services of an official accompanist are provided under terms stated in the section rules and conditions of entry. If a competitor brings his/her own accompanist, the Adjudicator may take in to account the adequacy of the accompanist when assessing the performance. (b) Any competitor requiring the services of an official accompanist must forward one copy of their 'Own Choice' to the section secretary as detailed in that section's programme. All competitors must supply one copy for the use of the Adjudicator, this to be handed to the section organiser before the commencement of the class concerned. 'Own choice' copies must be legible.

'The Music Publisher's Association Code of Practice on photocopying copyright works makes the following concessions for copying own choice pieces from volumes only for the use of the adjudicator at a festival, provided that the entrant or participant has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the administrator of the festival immediately after the event. All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously, responded to swiftly and appropriately and all the charity's trustees/organisers/staff/volunteers have a responsibility to report concerns.

**Purpose & Function of Organisation:** The objective of the Festival is to provide a platform for amateur performance and to advance the education of the public in the Arts, both the Performing Arts and Visual Arts.

**The Festival Environment:** Our festivals are held in a variety of buildings, though performers/competitors do not need to move between them unless attending different events. All have areas open to the public. The Nuneaton Festival of Arts is a charity (Registered Charity Number 1041379) and is run by volunteers.

**To whom does this policy apply?:** This policy relates to children under the age of 18 years and members of vulnerable groups of any age whose needs are identified to the festival organisers by parents/guardians/carers and/or teachers prior to their arrival at our festival. The organisers actively seek to meet special needs notified to them. We do this by ensuring that you receive a copy of this policy at the time you are making arrangements to attend our festival.

**Festival Personnel:** Festival helpers are recruited through section organisers and through local press/ publications. The Festival secretary holds names and addresses of all members of the Festival Committee and stewards. They will be identifiable at events by name badges; (Section Secretaries have a green badge), any problems should be referred to them. All concerns will be documented and dated. Job descriptions are provided for section organisers, their assistants, volunteers and members of the Executive. All jobs are reviewed to see if they need enhanced CRB checks.

**Preparation for Attendance at the Festival:** This policy is sent out in the Festival syllabus and is available on our web site. It is sent to individual entrants with their tickets – the fact that individuals arrive for the appropriate classes indicates that they have also received the policy. A letter is sent to private teachers and group leaders with the policy. This letter has to be signed and returned to the section organizer as proof that the information has been passed to parents. Entries cannot be accepted unless a declaration has been signed and returned as it may damage our organisation if participants fail to follow our safeguarding policy. One copy of the policy is sent to state/private schools where the entries are "school regulated events" (i.e. the teacher accompanies the pupils because it is a school activity). It is assumed that the school has done all that is necessary to gain permission from parents for the children to attend. Where parents/guardians/carers are not personally attending with their children, this policy requires them to be satisfied that their children will be accompanied to the festival and adequately supervised by responsible adults acting on their behalf. The policy is sent to parents/guardians/carers/teachers so that they become partners in implementing this policy.

**Performance Areas and Changing Areas:** Whilst every effort will be made to provide a safe environment at the Festival, children are the responsibility of their parents/guardians/carers/teachers in charge. The Festival is run by volunteers and no supervision is provided between classes or in the lunch break. Public areas, practice rooms, toilets and changing areas will not be supervised by Festival Stewards on the days of the Festival. This is the responsibility of adults accompanying children and young people.

**Photographs, Videotapes & Press Photography:** No tape recording, photography, mobile phone or video filming of any kind will be allowed in any class at the Festival. The committee reserves the right to require any person infringing this rule to leave the room where the class is being held. All mobile phones must be switched off during classes.

**Review:** The organisers will regularly review the policy, revising and enhancing it as necessary. In doing this they will look to the British and International Federation of Festivals for support. That body, in turn, will look to other agencies for good practice, most notably the NSPCC and Arts Council of England policy guidelines.

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
