

Adjudicator: Nathan Parker

Nathan Parker is an internationally known street artist based in Nuneaton, specializing in large-scale mural art created with spray paint. With over 30 years of experience and a First-Class Honours degree in Illustration from Manchester Metropolitan University, Nathan has created murals across the UK, Spain, and Australia.

His inspiration is drawn from Aboriginal art and graffiti, where he finds aesthetic and conceptual influences, including visual languages, dual meanings, and cultural elements. Nathan's art often captures a sense of movement and narrative.

Beyond his artistry, Nathan has conducted workshops in various settings, including community centres, youth clubs, schools, and secure facilities, nurturing creativity and artistic skills within communities.

Nathan's murals are typically site-specific, responding to the locale and the community they are located in, allowing for direct interaction and feedback. Notable commissions include a mural at Digbeth Coach Station in Birmingham, celebrating 50 years of Black Sabbath, and a mural honouring England's footballers during the Euro finals.

His portfolio also includes smaller works exhibited globally in cities such as London, New York, Rome, Paris, Sydney, and Melbourne. Nathan has collaborated with clients like Red Bull, Channel 4, Stagecoach, LCFC, Leicester Tigers, Carling, Big Issue, Coventry City of Culture, Custard Factory and John Lewis.

Nathan has actively participated in various festivals, including Journey Festival International, City of Culture 2021 (Coventry), Upfest (Bristol), Bring The Paint (Leicester), High Vis (Birmingham), Cheltenham Paint Festival, Leamington Art in The Park, and Godiva Festival (Coventry), contributing to the contemporary art scene. His work continues to engage communities and art enthusiasts alike.

He once again is looking forward to adjudicating the Art section at the Nuneaton Festival of Arts in 2025.

ART SECTION RULES AND CONDTIONS OF ENTRY 2025

- 1. Amateurs only.
- 2. Booking a time slot for entry.

Bookings need to be made to deliver and collect your entries via Ticket Tailor/Nuneaton Festival of Arts from Wednesday 5th February - Wednesday 5th March 2025

3. **Entry form** - Please bring a completed entry and insurance form together with your work and entry fee to the Nuneaton Museum on entry day. To comply with the Safeguarding Policy procedures the official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form MUST be completed and signed.

NB: 'CLASS' refers to the Festival class number

- 4. **Receipt** Retain your receipt safely as it will be needed when you collect your work at the end of the exhibition.
- 5. **Payment** may be made by cheque (payable to Nuneaton Festival of Arts), cash, BACS or bank card. **Sort code: 30-96-26 A/C: 80044268**
- 6. Entries Individuals: 3 entries per person. Schools and Colleges: 35 per school or college
- 7. **Sizes** as there is limited exhibition space, please note that the maximum size required in the section you are entering.

Oversized GROUP entries can be adjudicated, but due to reduced hanging space it may not be hung or displayed. Please contact Section Secretary before the entry day.

<u>ADULT ENTRIES ONLY</u> - Your entry can be for sale, the sale will be handled by the Nuneaton Museum.

- 8. Late entries cannot be accepted
- 9. **Labels Two** labels with name, (and school or group if applicable) title of work and **Festival** class number. **One** on the back of the work and **one** attached by string to the back of entry so that it can be seen clearly when hung over the face of the work.

(Schools may put child's name on front if they wish to)

- 10. Framing Individual entries Under 18 years framing is optional. Over 18 years all work must be framed. The framing needs to be firm, rigid and sturdy in good condition and appropriate to the size of work. See framing guidance notes on pages 6 and 7
- 11. Collection You will be able to sign up for a collection slot when you bring your entry.
- 12. **Results** -Will be available 3 days after the adjudication on the Festival's website and if you have been given an award you will be notified by the Section Secretary with details of the presentation.
- 13. LATE COLLECTION WILL BE CHARGED AT £1 PER DAY AND NO RESPONSIBILTY WILL BE TAKEN FOR CONDITION OF ENTRIES AFTER THIS DATE.

 THEY WILL BE DISPOSED OF AFTER 2 WEEKS.

ART:USE OF PAINT AND/OR OTHER MARK MAKERS - (eg graphite, pencil, inks etc) IF USING OTHER MATERIALS, NATURAL OR MAN MADE, PLEASE ENTER IN THE CRAFT SECTION; HOWEVER A SMALL AMOUNT OF OTHER MATERIALS AS PART OF THE MAIN ART WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED.

The Sydney F. Vickers Memorial Bursary of £100 will be awarded annually to the entrant in

classes 52-55 for: Excellence in

Design Presentation. The Cup is awarded for: Innovation and Inspirational Fashion Design

To be awarded and accepted under the following rules and conditions:

- 1. The winner will be chosen by the Adjudicator.
- 2. The bursary will be used by the recipient to purchase materials, tuition or other, pursuant to Fashion Design.
- 3. The recipient will undertake to submit a written report to the Chair of the Festival Committee outlining the use to which the bursary has been or is intended to be used, no later than 31st July following the festival.

ART Conditions and Guidance Notes

- A. <u>General</u>: The aim of these arrangements is to ensure the smooth running, good hanging and security of your work. Exhibits to be displayed in the white and yellow gallery
 - Only Museum and Art gallery staff will arrange and hang works. All pictures must be framed, clip frames are not appropriate. The Museum and Art gallery's decision on inclusion will be final.

B. Sale of Work:

- Artists over 18 years of age may submit up to 3 pieces of their own artwork for sale in this exhibition.
- When pricing work, artist should bear in mind that the sale price should be inclusive of 25% commission and 25% VAT (on commission) charged on sales by the Museum and Art Gallery
- Sales are dealt with by the Museum and Art Gallery staff. Cheques from purchasers are made payable to the artist. The artist will be paid after the exhibition has finished
- Only works which are present at the Museum and Art Gallery can be sold through the exhibition

C. Labelling of Work:

- All works must have 2 labels, the first on the back with the artist's name, title of work, medium, current price and number on the final list. The second label should be attached to a string onto the hanging cord, so that it can be clearly seen if hung over the face of the work; this helps staff enormously when checking and hanging the exhibition
- For displays in the Yellow Gallery classes 31 to 51, all framed works must be securely screw eyed and strung ready for hanging; those not strung cannot be displayed. The framing needs to be firm, rigid, sturdy in good condition and appropriate to the size of the work.

D. **Acceptance, Display and Return of Works:

- The Museum will issue the artist with a receipt form to complete. On deposit of work, Museum staff will check off the condition of the works. A copy of the receipt is given to the artist, who then brings it at the end of the exhibition to identify, check and collect work.
- Time must be allowed for the condition of each individual work to be assessed and agreed by both the artist, or their authorised representative and a member of the Gallery staff.
- All works shall continue to be displayed until the official end of the exhibition, when they will be available for collection.
- Results will be available 3 days after adjudication on the Festival's website or from Nuneaton Museum and Art Gallery after 10.30 am on the opening day of the exhibition.

LATE COLLECTION WILL BE CHARGED AT £1 PER DAY AND NO RESPONSIBILITY WILL BE TAKEN FOR CONDITION OF ENTRIES AFTER THIS DATE. THEY WILL BE DISPOSED OF AFTER 2 WEEKS.

N.B. Artists must bring their receipt when collecting work and must telephone the Museum and Art Gallery
with the name of the proxy if arranging for someone else to collect their work.

 Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council does not accept responsibility for loss or damage to articles lent for temporary exhibitions, unless such loss or damage arises directly as a result of negligence on the part of the Council or its officer.

Please note: You will have to complete delivery and collection forms for the Museum when entering work. You can obtain these forms in advance from the Museum, this may help save time when you deliver your work.





2025 Festival of Arts: Hanging Requirements

All Art (classes 31 - 51) and Photography classes must be labelled and framed and securely screw eyed and strung ready for hanging. These guidelines are also relevant to any children's work if framed., other children's work will be Blu tacked or pinned on display boards.



A label should be attached to the back of the frame that can be hung over the front, to enable gallery staff with the hanging.



Screw eyes should be put into the frame and string attached for hanging. Please use picture string not wire, as wire makes the pictures difficult to hang. A second label should be attached to the back of the frame. Please do not attach the label that hangs over the front to the screw eye as this makes it difficult to hide during the exhibition. Please ensure the screw eyes or D rings are attached to the frame of the work and not the board at the back. The frame should be of sufficient thickness to ensure that screw eyes are secure.

Labels need to be attached to all framed and unframed work. Both labels should include the artist's name, title of the work, size and selling price (if appropriate). If the work is not for sale please put NFS. Information on labels must match the information on entry forms.

Clip frames are not appropriate for hanging and work will not be accepted in clip frames. The Festival reserves the right to refuse any works that do not meet requirements.

There is a charge of £1 per item per day for the storage of uncollected work. All work should be delivered and collected on the agreed dates and times, unless prior arrangements have been made with the section secretary/ publicity officer.
