

Nathan Parker is an internationally known street artist based in Nuneaton, specializing in large-scale mural art created with spray paint. With over 30 years of experience and a First-Class Honours degree in Illustration from Manchester Metropolitan University, Nathan has created murals across the UK,

His inspiration is drawn from Aboriginal art and graffiti, where he finds aesthetic and conceptual influences, including visual languages, dual meanings, and cultural elements. Nathan's art often captures a sense of movement and narrative.

Beyond his artistry, Nathan has conducted workshops in various settings, including community centres, youth clubs, schools, and secure facilities, nurturing creativity and artistic skills within communities.

Nathan's murals are typically site-specific, responding to the locale and the community they are located in, allowing for direct interaction and feedback. Notable commissions include a mural at Digbeth Coach Station in Birmingham, celebrating 50 years of Black Sabbath, and a mural honouring England's footballers during the Euro finals.

His portfolio also includes smaller works exhibited globally in cities such as London, New York, Rome, Paris, Sydney, and Melbourne. His work continues to engage communities and art enthusiasts alike.

My first steps into photography was when my Dad gave me a fully loaded (12 exposure film) in my Brownie 127 for my school trip to London when I was 10 way back in 1966, needless to say I shot the whole roll! That was that and so between me and my Dad we built an enlarger out of a Fox's Glacier Mint tin and secure adjustable vertical bar and base board plus an old set of bellows and lens and away I went with producing black and white enlargements as well as film development, all this came to an abrupt end when my counterpane on my bed fell to pieces due to the chemicals, Mum wasn't too happy!

Move forward to roughly 1978 'ish and I was apprentice in the Light Alloy Metallurgical laboratory at Sterling Metals in Nuneaton where my photographic skills surfaced once again. A few short years later I was offered the job as photographer with the newly produced Nuneaton and Bedworth Trader free paper, a chance I took with both hands and the start of a smashing 30 odd year employment seeing me getting to see and get involved in varying Press Calls. It was certainly a dream come true and not bad to be paid for your hobby.

There were local events and of course plenty of sport to cover, where you only had that one roll of film to get an image to portray that event. One excellent example of this was when I was covering the 1987 FA Cup final of Coventry City vs Tottenham Hotspur I was fortunately level on the side of the pitch when a header was sent towards the goal and as I hit the camera button the ball was in the net and my camera had stopped firing, with no screen to check your shots, I had to wait until I was back in the office to develop my films. It was a 36 exposure b& w film with the flying headed goal being recorded perfectly on exposure No 37! Sometimes you get lucky



Dr Luan Shaw has been an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals since 2001, initially as a woodwind specialist, and since 2005 as a generalist, adjudicating across all disciplines.

Luan's portfolio career spans 30 years, involving solo, orchestral, and chamber music performance, recording for television and radio, instrumental, classroom and ensemble teaching. She has delivered hundreds of music workshops and interactive performances in nurseries, primary schools, special schools, hospitals and care homes and has conducted choirs and instrumental ensembles in her local community. Luan was Head of Instrumental Studies at Hallfield School in Birmingham from 2000-2008 and a Moderator for AQA's A-Level Music examinations (focusing on Performance) across 2008-10.

Luan worked as a Diploma examiner for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music from 2008-22, and was a recording artist for their 2018-21 clarinet syllabus. In addition to performing with the CBSO, Manchester Camerata, BCMG, Opera North and Longborough Festival Opera, Luan was Co-principal Clarinet with Orchestra of the Swan from 2007-2021.

Luan is now Director of Postgraduate Studies (Music) at Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, where she has taught since 2011. She is a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy, and was made an Honorary Member of RBC in 2001. In her former role as RBC's first Head of Pedagogy (2011-2018), she led the significant expansion of provision for instrumental teacher education across the RBC curriculum. Luan has also previously held the position of Interim Vice Principal, with oversight of learning and teaching in music. Luan is passionate about helping students to build their portfolio careers. Her doctoral research, completed in 2022 focused on facilitating the transition from student to professional through instrumental teacher education in conservatoires and she now publishes and presents her research via international journals and conferences. Luan received a National Teaching Fellowship from Advance HE in 2023 in recognition of her outstanding commitment to music education and her championing of instrumental teacher training.

1) Entry Forms

4) Multiple Entries

- a) Competitors may enter more than once in the same class **EXCEPT** solo classes, **providing** in a set piece class they play a different instrument/part or piece of music.
- b) Competitors may not perform the same piece in more than one class.
- 5) **Age Limit** The age limit for all classes in this section is 1st September following the competition. In group classes, all competitors must be within the age limit.

NB Infringement of rules 2-5 will result in competitors being adjudicated but not marked.

6) Official Accompanist

- a) The services of the Official Accompanist are available to competitors. Competitors must indicate their requirement of this facility on their entry form. Competitors using this service will be required to pay an additional fee of £4.00 per class entered.
- b) Where the Official Accompanist has been requested, performers in all classes are asked to ensure that all music is sent to the Section Secretary by 31st March 2025. It is strongly recommended that performers arrange at least one practice session beforehand with the Official Accompanist. This will be a private agreement, subject to the Official Accompanist's fees.

7) Music

- a) Set Piece Performances should include all repeats unless detailed differently. Performers of Own Choice Pieces should observe *da capo* and *dal segno* indications, and may play other repeats within the appropriate time limits.
- b) Own choice titles and composers MUST be given on the Entry Form. Competitors failing to give this information will have their entry forms returned. Competitors offering a different piece to that specified on their entry form are requested to inform the Section Secretary, in writing, at least two weeks before the date of the Performance. N.B. Failure to do so will result in competitors being adjudicated but not marked.
- c) A copy of the "own choice" piece of music MUST be made available for the use of the Adjudicator. This may be a photocopy, which will be retained by the Section Secretary and destroyed after the competition. Competitors are reminded that they <u>must not</u> use photocopies for the Performance unless written permission of the publisher is obtained and given to the Section Secretary.
- d) The Festival is under a legal obligation to supply to the Performing Rights Society details of all items performed at the Festival, and the co-operation of teachers and competitors in sending information at the correct time would be very much appreciated.

8) Late Entries

Late entries will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances, and may not appear in the programme.

9) Changes to Programme

The timing of classes will be arranged to suit the section as a whole and not to accommodate individual performers. No changes can be made after the programme is completed.

10) Festival's General Rules

Competitors/Teachers/ Parents are also requested to read the Festival's General Rules which can be found in the Full Syllabus, on the Festival's web site (www.nuneatonfoa.org.uk) or obtained from the section secretary. In particular your attention is drawn to General Rule 3. In this connection there are now two classes for Teachers to enter with their Pupils (M.TP1 and M.TP2), where General Rule 3 does not apply.

SAFETY OF PERFORMERS

It is necessary for teachers and parents to be aware of their responsibilities in entering performers with limited physical or special needs, bearing in mind the limitations imposed by the stage and surrounding environment. It is also necessary for the teacher or parent to pass on to the adjudicator, via the organiser, any such information that would impact on the adjudicator's work.

ART Conditions and Guidance Notes 2025

A. General: The aim of these arrangements is to ensure the smooth running, good hanging and security of your work. Exhibits to be displayed in the white and yellow gallery
 Only Museum and Art gallery staff will arrange and hang works. All pictures must be framed, clip frames are not appropriate. The Museum and Art gallery's decision on inclusion will be final.

B. Sale of Work:

Artists over 18 years of age may submit up to 3 pieces of their own artwork for sale in this exhibition.

When pricing work, artist should bear in mind that the sale price should be inclusive of 25% commission and 25% VAT (on commission) charged on sales by the Museum and Art Gallery

Sales are dealt with by the Museum and Art Gallery staff. Cheques from purchasers are made payable to the artist.

The artist will be paid after the exhibition has finished

Only works which are present at the Museum and Art Gallery can be sold through the exhibition.

C. Labelling of Work:

All works must have 2 labels, the first on the back with the artist's name, title of work, medium, current price and number on the final list. The second label should be attached to a string onto the hanging cord, so that it can be clearly seen if hung over the face of the work; this helps staff enormously when checking and hanging the exhibition For displays in the Yellow Gallery - classes 31 to 51, all framed works must be securely screw eyed and strung ready for hanging; those not strung cannot be displayed. The framing needs to be firm, rigid, sturdy in good condition and appropriate to the size of the work.

D. **Acceptance, Display and Return of Works:

The Museum will issue the artist with a receipt form to complete. On deposit of work, Museum staff will check off the condition of the works. A copy of the receipt is given to the artist, who then brings it at the end of the exhibition to identify, check and collect work.

Time must be allowed for the condition of each individual work to be assessed and agreed by both the artist, or their authorised representative and a member of the Gallery staff.

All works shall continue to be displayed until the official end of the exhibition, when they will be available for collection.

Results will be available 3 days after adjudication on the Festival's website or from Nuneaton Museum and Art Gallery after 10.30 am on the opening day of the exhibition.

LATE COLLECTION WILL BE CHARGED AT £1 PER DAY AND NO RESPONSIBILITY WILL BE TAKEN FOR CONDITION
OF ENTRIES AFTER THIS DATE. THEY WILL BE DISPOSED OF AFTER 2 WEEKS.

N.B. Artists must bring their receipt when collecting work and must telephone the Museum and Art Gallery with the name of the proxy if arranging for someone else to collect their work.

E. Insurance:

Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council does not accept responsibility for loss or damage to articles lent for temporary exhibitions, unless such loss or damage arises directly as a result of negligence on the part of the Council or its officer.

Please note: You will have to complete delivery and collection forms for the Museum when entering work. You can obtain these forms in advance from the Museum, this may help save time when you deliver your work.





2025 Festival of Arts: Hanging Requirements

All Art (classes 31 - 51) and Photography classes must be labelled and framed and securely screw eyed and strung ready for hanging. These guidelines are also relevant to any children's work if framed., other children's work will be Blu tacked or pinned on display boards.



A label should be attached to the back of the frame that can be hung over the front, to enable gallery staff with the hanging.



Screw eyes should be put into the frame and string attached for hanging. Please use picture string <u>not</u> wire, as wire makes the pictures difficult to hang. A second label should be attached to the back of the frame. Please do not attach the label that hangs over the front to the screw eye as this makes it difficult to hide during the exhibition. Please ensure the screw eyes or D rings are attached to the frame of the work and not the board at

3. How do we use your personal data?

We will use your personal data in a number of ways which may include:

- a) Processing your entry form to take part in the festival.
- b) Keeping you updated about your entry to the festival.
- c) Sending you copies of our syllabus.
- d) Keeping you updated about future festivals
- e) Processing any applications for a paid or unpaid role within the festival
- f) Processing any donations made to us.
- g) Including your name in our printed programme. (Names of entrants in creative arts are not shown the programme)
- h) Managing any orders for publications or other materials from us.
- i) Processing your application to be involved in our governance such as becoming a member of our Committee.
- j) Responding to a general enquiry made to us.
- k) Dealing with a complaint or concern raised to us about one of our staff/volunteers/contractors.
- I) Include your photo or name on our website or social media.

4. Who do you share my share my personal data with?

We will only ever use your personal data to manage your festival involvement with us including keeping you up-to-date with any festival news.

If you are not involved in the festival, then we will only use your personal data to deal with the issue or enquiry that you have raised directly with us.

We will never sell your details to any third party and we do not buy any personal data.

We may share or disclose your personal data if we are required to do so by any law or court order.

5. What is the legal basis for processing my information?

In some cases, we will only process your personal data where we have your specific consent to do so e.g. to include your name in our programme/to use your photo on our website/to stay in touch with you about our next festival.

We may also process your personal data because there is a legitimate interest for us to do so as part of our work, and it is reasonable to expect that your information would need to be processed by us for to complete this work. We will hold personal data relating to:

- Your festival entry for 5 years following the end the festival. Trophy winners' details will be retained until the trophies are returned safely to the festival.
- Employment or volunteering with the festival indefinitely.
- Legacies or donations for 6 years after the legacy or donation is received
- •Subscribing to email updates about future festivals you can unsubscribe at any time from our mailing list.. We are legally required to hold some personal data to fulfil statutory obligations, to support certain financial transactions.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. The closing date for entries is as stated in each section
- 2. Except where specific section rules apply, the age limit date for group entries is 1st September. For individual entries it is the first day of any section competition. The signature on the entry form will be the guarantee that the competitor's age is correct. The committee reserves the right to request to see a birth certificate should any question arise.
- 3. Competitors must be amateur* bona fide members of the organisation they represent.

*Amateur is defined as a person who does not make his/her <u>living</u>, by <u>performing</u> or <u>teaching</u>, in the discipline involved; e.g. a teacher may be allowed to enter, at the Festivals discretion, if playing a different instrument from that upon which he/she makes a living.

- 4. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- To comply with the Safe Guarding Policy and Privacy Policy the Official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form MUST be completed and signed.
- 6. Email entries will be accepted, however, cheque/cash/bank transfer for the entry fee together with the signed declarations on the application form **MUST** be received by the section secretary by the closing date for entries. The email **MUST** give all the information requested on the entry form, (Entry forms are available to download on the Festival website).
- 7. Competitors are limited to the number of entries they can make. Please see individual sections for the number of entries allowed
- 8. The Committee may decline to accept an entry or may limit, cancel or subdivide any competition.
- 9. First, second and third place certificates may be awarded in each class to competitors who gain the three highest number of marks. The Adjudicator may, at his/her discretion, withhold the award of a first or second place certificate where there are fewer than three competitors and a third place certificate where there are less than ten competitors. In the event of a tie for one of the places, a certificate will be awarded to each competitor gaining the relevant mark. An Adjudicator may also withhold place awards and trophies where he/she considers that the standard is not sufficiently high to merit them. Certificates of Achievement will be awarded in accordance with the Adjudicator's decision.
- 10. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 11. Trophies are awarded for a nominal year only. All trophies must be returned the following year to the section secretary by the date stated on the Trophy receipts.
- 12. Winners of classes should be prepared to take part in a Festival concert or event if required to do so PERFORMING ARTS ONLY (Piano, Speech and Drama, Stage Dancing, Vocal, Woodwind, Strings and Brass)
- 13. (Not applicable to Stage Dancing) Competitors will only be admitted on production of their admission cards. These will be forwarded to the competitors and will be applicable for the session indicated on the card. Competitors who have not received the card fourteen days before the adjudication period should contact the section secretary.
- 14. The order of competing is determined at the Section Secretary's discretion.
- 15. Every effort will be made to adhere to the schedule, however, should alterations be necessary, entrance fees will not be returned after the programme has been finalised and adjudicator and venue booked.
- 16. Competitors who do not respond when called upon to perform may be disqualified.
- 17. Competitors must collect adjudication sheets, copies of music, texts and any certificates from the Adjudicator's steward at the end of each class. (For Stage Dancing only collect at the end of the day). Requests for posting these must be agreed with that steward and postage prepaid.
- 18. No competitor may perform more than once in the same class OR play the same piece in more than one class.
- 19. No photography or filming by equipment of any kind, including mobile phones, is allowed <u>during Performances</u>. Permission for photographs of their own child receiving an award, for personal use, may be given by the section secretary, upon request.
- 20. (a) The services of an official accompanist are provided under terms stated in the section rules and conditions of entry. If a competitor brings his/her own accompanist, the Adjudicator may take in to account the adequacy of the accompanist when assessing the Performance. (b) Any competitor requiring the services of an official accompanist must forward one copy of their 'Own Choice' to the section secretary as detailed in that section's programme. All competitors must supply one copy for the use of the Adjudicator, this to be handed to the section organiser before the commencement of the class concerned. 'Own choice' copies must be legible.

'The Music Publisher's Association Code of Practice on photocopying copyright works makes the following concessions for copying own choice pieces from volumes only for the use of the adjudicator at a festival, provided that the entrant or participant has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the administrator of the festival immediately after the event. This permission specifically does not apply to set works. Single copies of items may not be photocopied without the prior permission of the copyright holder.'

ALL SECTIONS

- 21. Any complaint about the infringement of these rules must be made to the appropriate section secretary **WITHIN THIRTY MINUTES** of the end of the class concerned. (Performing Arts sections), **or ONE WEEK** from the close of the presentation event. (All other sections).
- 22. Any changes to the rules shall be made at the Annual General Meeting. All proposed changes must be submitted to the general secretary, in writing, at least three weeks before this meeting. The general secretary shall then call a meeting of the Executive Committee, which will report upon the proposed change to the rules to the AGM; then if necessary, make recommendations concerning the proposed change.
- 23. The Committee reserves the right to decide on any matter not covered by these rules.

Dates: January – June annually.

Preliminary Statement: The safety of vulnerable adults and children is paramount and all, without exception, have the right to protection from abuse. All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously, responded to swiftly and appropriately and all the charity's trustees/organisers/staff/volunteers have a responsibility to report concerns.

Purpose & Function of Organisation: The objective of the Festival is to provide a platform for amateur Performance and to advance the education of the public in the Arts, both the Performing Arts and Visual Arts.

The Festival Environment: Our festivals are held in a variety of buildings, though performers/competitors do not need to move between them unless attending different events. All have areas open to the public. The Nuneaton Festival of Arts is a charity (Registered Charity Number 1041379) and is run by volunteers.

To whom does this policy apply?: This policy relates to children under the age of 18 years and members of vulnerable groups of any age whose needs are identified to the festival organisers by parents/guardians/carers and/or teachers prior to their arrival at our festival. The organisers actively seek to meet special needs notified to them. We do this by ensuring that you receive a copy of this policy at the time you are making arrangements to attend our festival.

Festival Personnel: Festival helpers are recruited through section organisers and through local press/ publications. The Festival secretary holds names and addresses of all members of the Festival Committee and stewards. They will be identifiable at events by name badges; (Section Secretaries have a green badge), any problems should be referred to them. All concerns will be documented and dated. Job descriptions are provided for section organisers, their assistants, volunteers and members of the Executive. All jobs are reviewed to see if they need enhanced CRB checks.

Preparation for Attendance at the Festival: This policy is sent out in the Festival syllabus and is available on our web site. It is sent to individual entrants with their tickets – the fact that individuals arrive for the appropriate classes indicates that they have also received the policy. A letter is sent to private teachers and group leaders with the policy. This letter has to be signed and returned to the section organizer as proof that the information has been passed to parents. Entries cannot be accepted unless a declaration has been signed and returned as it may damage our organisation if participants fail to follow our safeguarding policy. One copy of the policy is sent to state/private schools where the entries are "school regulated events" (i.e. the teacher accompanies the pupils because it is a school activity). It is assumed that the school has done all that is necessary to gain permission from parents for the children to attend. Where parents/guardians/carers are not personally attending with their children, this policy requires them to be satisfied that their children will be accompanied to the festival and adequately supervised by responsible adults acting on their behalf. The policy is sent to parents/guardians/carers/teachers so that they become partners in implementing this policy.

Performance Areas and Changing Areas: Whilst every effort will be made to provide a safe environment at the Festival, children are the responsibility of their parents/guardians/carers/teachers in charge. The Festival is run by volunteers and no supervision is provided between classes or in the lunch break. Public areas, practice rooms, toilets and changing areas will not be supervised by Festival Stewards on the days of the Festival. **This is the responsibility of adults accompanying children and young people.**


Photographs, Videotapes & Press Photography: No tape recording, photography, mobile phone or video filming of any kind will be allowed in any class at the Festival. The committee reserves the right to require any person infringing this rule to leave the room where the class is being held. All mobile phones must be switched off during classes.

Review: The organisers will regularly review the policy, revising and enhancing it as necessary. In doing this they will look to the British and International Federation of Festivals for support. That body, in turn, will look to other agencies for good practice, most notably the NSPCC and Arts Council of England policy guidelines.


