Original Writing Section rules and conditions of entry

- 1. Entry Forms: Competitors must send their entry form and fee to the section secretary by the closing date. To comply with the safeguarding procedures, the official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form MUST be completed and signed. Amateurs only. (Entry forms are available to download from the Festival website).
- 2. **Payment:** Payment may be made by cheque, (made payable to Nuneaton Festival of Arts), cash or by Bank transfer. **ADD THE PREFIX 'OWA' or OWJ' TO YOUR PAYMENT REFERENCE**
- 3. Entries: Only 3 entries per class allowed per individual.

NB: 'CLASS' REFERS TO THE FESTIVAL CLASS NUMBER

- 4. Late Entries: late entries will be considered
- Paper: Please use one side of A4 paper only. Each page must be labelled with <u>Name and Festival class number.</u>
 - **DO NOT** mount work especially for the Festival, though we will accept if already mounted.
- 6. **Schools:** may submit block entries (full fees required) to cover a selection of work provided the names and year groups of children whose work is entered are clearly marked and with the name of the school.
- 7. **SAE: ADULT SECTION ONLY**. Please enclosed a large stamped addressed envelope if the work is not to be collected personally after the adjudication.
- 8. **Nom-de-Plume**: Entries using pseudonym (adult section only) will be accepted in all adult classes but, the competitor's real name and address must be sent to the section secretary in a sealed envelope.
- 9. **Names:** Competitors' names will not appear in the programme.
- 10. **Results:** Competitors' allocated an award will be notified and invited to attend a presentation evening.
