SAFETY OF PERFORMERS

After studies at Oxford University and the Royal College of Music, Luise's career as a professional Soprano soloist took her throughout the UK, Europe, America and South Africa.

Luise has held teaching positions in both the Junior and Senior departments of Birmingham Conservatoire and as a visiting lecturer at Birmingham University. She runs an extensive private teaching practice and regularly gives masterclasses, choral workshops, presentations and teacher sessions both at home and abroad. She has worked as a mentor on the CT ABRSM panel and as a vocal coach on residential courses for singers. She has also trained and conducted the Wyre Forest Young Voices Choir. She has recently taken up an appointment as the singing teacher at Keble College, Oxford and has become a Vocal Health First Aider.

For many years as Associate Chief Examiner in music for Trinity College London, Luise has worked on syllabus setting and leading projects for diplomas, examiner training and teacher support. Publications include a series of books on Musical Theatre repertoire and graded songbooks. She is a highly experienced adjudicator member of the British & International Federation of Festivals and was privileged to be an adjudicator for the inaugural Olga and Jules Craen Young Musician of the Year award in Mumbai, India and for the first Maltese Islands Festival in Valletta, Malta as well as adjudicating and running workshops at the Singapore Performing Arts Festival.

She is looking forward to adjudicating at the Nuneaton Festival of Arts in 2026

These cash prizes will be awarded and accepted under the following rules and conditions:

1. The winners will be nominated by the Adjudicator of each of the relevant sections.
2. The prize money will be used by the recipients to purchase materials, tuition or other pursuant to their particular discipline
3. The recipients undertake to submit a written report to the Chair of the Festival Committee outlining the use to which the prize money has been or is intended to be used, no later than 31st July following the competition.

Vocal Section Rules & Conditions of Entry: Amateur only!

● **Entry:** Competitors must send their entry form and fee to the section secretary by the closing date. To comply with safeguarding procedures, the official Nuneaton Festival of Arts entry form must be completed and signed. (entry forms are available to download from the Festival website). **NB: 'CLASS' REFERS TO THE FESTIVAL CLASS NUMBER.**

● **Email entries:** This must give all the information requested on the entry form. However, the entry fee, together with the signed declaration on the entry form MUST also be sent to the section secretary by the closing date.

PLEASE ADD THE PREFIX 'VO' IN THE REFERENCE SECTION AND THE ENTRANT'S SURNAME so that your payment can be correctly allocated.

● **Multiple entries:** There is no limit to the number of classes a competitor can enter but you cannot perform more than once in each class or sing the same song in more than one class.

● **Time limit:** Songs must be no longer than 3 minutes 30 seconds in length, including the introduction. Marks may be deducted if this limit is exceeded.

● **Late entries:** These will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances and at the discretion of the section secretary.

● **Own-choice titles:** These must be given on the entry form. The Festival is under a legal obligation to supply to the Performing Rights Society details of all the items performed at the Festival. The cooperation of teachers and competitors in sending information at the correct time would be very much appreciated.

● **Music:** In the classical song section, a copy of the piece of music MUST be made available for the use of the adjudicator.

For Musical theatre and Pop Songs, lyrics may be provided instead if the musical score is unavailable.

● **Accompanist:** The fee for each song is £4.50 to cover the official Federation rate of payment. Competitors requiring this service should forward a copy of all music **by 31 March 2026** to **Mrs Rosemary Robinson email:** rosemary.swissfamily@ntlworld.com.

Please ensure you write the competitor's name and class number on each copy.

Where there is more than one page of music, please DO NOT staple them together. They should be sellotaped in lengths of not more than 4 sheets. Also check that the quality of print is good.

● **Backing tracks:** For classes at the Abbey Theatre, please bring a labelled USB stick for individual songs. Teachers may submit all songs on the one stick but please list them with class number, competitor's name and song titles. This will be played through the sound system of the theatre. Please adhere to playing order..

● **Photography:** No photography, recording or filming of any kind, including mobile phones, is allowed during the performances or adjudication.

● **Costume:** This is allowed but is not a requirement and the adjudication will not take it into account.
